## Do...

Get the groom involved in the DIY process, as it adds some extra memories.

Spend time searching for inspiration to get an idea of a theme you'd like.

/ Make a photobooth using t a backdrop, polaroid camera and frames.

Decide on a font and logo that you can use throughout your wedding to tie everything together neatly.

## Don't...

Attempt to do everything and family for help.

Try to take the place of professionals. Things like wedding photography should be left to those in the know.

Go over the top with decorations. Keeping a i neutral palette with splashes of colour looks better than having everything matching.

/ Assume that suppliers tunderstand your vision. Be clear and strong with them so you get what you want.

Get caught up making things that aren't a true reflection of who you are as a couple. Be efficient.
